6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college does not develop the curriculum; it is prescribed by the Tumkur University. But the faculty members of the college being members of Board of Studies of different subjects contribute in developing the curriculum.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The faculty members of the college make use of varied teaching methods to make learning more enjoyable and useful for the students. Using smart board facility, audio-visual methods, study tours, workshops, field visits and many more, students learn their subjects very effectively.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college does not control the examination and evaluation system directly as it is managed by the Tumkur University. But through internal examinations, assignments, and problem solving classes, students are examined and evaluated at college level. Also faculty members of the college being the members of the Board of Examinations of different subjects contribute to University Examination and Evaluation system. Also faculty members of our college contributes to University Examination and Evaluation system by setting the question papers, being present in the panel of evaluation.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Many of the faculty members of our college have research projects sanctioned by UGC, DST, VGST and other funding agencies and seriously involved in research activities. Also many of the faculty members are pursuing their Ph. D., and active in research and development works. Our faculty members do participate, present papers in national/international seminars, conferences and workshops throughout the year.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library of our college contains sufficient number of books for all the students. UGC recurring funds help library to acquire more books every year. Computerization and automation of library is under progress.

Many of our college class rooms are equipped with smart board and overhead projectors which helps the faculty members to use ICT facility to make their presentation more effective.

The college is getting funds from UGC for laboratory and other physical infrastructure development and the funds are made use efficiently and effectively.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Our existing faculty members have been given in charge as NSS officers, NCC officer and red cross officer in the college. Apart from this some are deputed as special officers, deputy registrar and physical education director for Tumkur University.
